Incident:	Spill During Vacuum Truck Maintenance at Bishop Street, Woolner, NT 0820

(a) the incident causing or threatening to cause pollution	Approximately 200 litres of oil was released from a vacuum truck during routine maintenance.
(b) the place where the incident occurred	Unit 4/32 Bishop St, Woolner NT 0820
(c) the date and time of the incident	03/09/2025 At approximately 5:00 pm
(d) how the pollution has occurred, is occurring or may occur	During routine maintenance of a vacuum truck, oil exited the truck when the back door was opened. The oil entered the onsite spoon drain and left the premises onto the adjacent nature strip. The oil remained confined to the nature strip and did not reach the surrounding soils, infrastructure, waterways, or stormwater drainage systems.
(e) the attempts made to prevent, reduce, control, rectify or clean up the pollution or resultant environmental harm caused or threatening to be caused by the incident	<p>The spill was immediately contained using spill response equipment.</p> <p>The premises has been cleaned with pressurised water to remove oil and staining from the concrete surface as well as the onsite spoon drain system. The wash waters have been removed by a vacuum truck.</p> <p>Vacuum excavator and pressure water have been used to remove contaminated soils from the nature strip outside of the premises.</p> <p>Samples of the remaining soil have been taken to confirm no remaining contamination on the soil outside the premises.</p>
