Incident:	Neighbouring property had wildfire spread onto 840 Stuart Highway and burnt stockpiles
(a) the incident causing or threatening to cause pollution	Stockpiles ETC. Mulch and compost heaps and cow manure was burnt to a smoulder – lost over \$10,000 in product. Now on tail end of it – minimal smoke and steam being released but not fully finished yet.
(b) the place where the incident occurred	840 Stuart highway Stockpiles Fire started from property on the rear
(c) the date and time of the incident	1/10/22 –
(d) how the pollution has occurred, is occurring or may occur	Piles are now slightly smouldering causing small amount of smoke and burnt odour. They have nearly finished. Approx 300-400m ³ of product has been burnt

<p>(e) the attempts made to prevent, reduce, control, rectify or clean up the pollution or resultant environmental harm caused or threatening to be caused by the incident</p>	<p>Our fire breaks and bunting walls have been made bigger now as the embers from fire blew into stockpiles causing them to burn even though these were implemented.</p> <p>Engaged water contractor and have pumped 7x 15,000 litres water tanks into piles to minimize burning and more loss of stock.</p> <p>Some piles were buried under copious amounts of dirt to suffocate – has made little difference.</p> <p>As mentioned, – the worst part is over now but some piles still smouldering causing slight smoke and odour. Water truck will be over there again in the next day or 2 to put 2x more tanks of water into stockpiles to keep burning and odour under control.</p>
