I have reviewed the Notice of Significant variation and provide the following heritage comments:

- Heritage Branch have met with representatives from Sun Cable directly about this project, and in particular about the proposed footprint and how it may impact on known heritage places and archaeological sites.
- Sun Cable has committed to conducting archaeological surveys of all areas that may be impacted by the project
- Heritage Branch has also been in touch with the archaeological consultants that will undertake the surveys and we have provided information about known/existing heritage places and archaeological sites directly to them to incorporate into their studies.
- Heritage Branch will expect to receive a copy of any archaeological survey reports that identify any new Aboriginal or Macassan archaeological sites, so that they can be entered into the Archaeological Sites Database.

These are the main issues and we feel that they have been adequately addressed for the moment and we have no further concerns with this project at this time.
