<b>Date and Time of Notification:</b>	25/5/2022
<b>Person / Company:</b>	Thamarrurr Development Corporation
<b>Incident:</b>	Grass fire caused stored waste oil, batteries & tyres to ignite

<b>(a) the incident causing or threatening to cause pollution</b>	Grass fire burnt waste oil, old tyres & batteries stored at the front of the workshop
<b>(b) the place where the incident occurred</b>	TDC Mechanical Workshop Lot 485 Wadeye, 0822 NT
<b>(c) the date and time of the incident</b>	21/5/2022 18.00hrs
<b>(d) how the pollution has occurred, is occurring or may occur</b>	Smoke pollution caused by grass fire igniting waste oil, tyres & batteries
<b>(e) the attempts made to prevent, reduce, control, rectify or clean up the pollution or resultant environmental harm caused or threatening to be caused by the incident</b>	Fire was left alone to burn down till Sunday morning as fire was too intense to attempt to put it out. Police investigation was carried out Sunday 22 <sup>nd</sup> May. On Monday 23 <sup>rd</sup> the area external to the workshop was cleared of debris and any remaining waste oil decanted into drums and stored inside the workshop. No oil spillage has occurred.
