The Traffic Management Plan (TMP) addresses "Construction Traffic" advising that a Construction Traffic Management Plan (CTMP) would be prepared prior to commencing construction, and advises that the increased traffic movements to/from the proposed development, and existing conditions of the Stuart Highway transport/network are all suitable. The TMP highlights that the Singleton Station Access Road/ Stuart Highway intersection is <b>expected</b> to operate under 'excellent' conditions with minor queues and delays which are expected to not be substantial to motorists, and the "new access" from the Stuart Highway will result in "insignificant" traffic impacts to the local community. There is no mention in the report providing an assessment of the design vehicle suitability for either intersection, or proposed location/suitability of the new access intersection. This should be considered prior to the CTMP to ensure to suitability of 'at least' the location of the new access, and submitted to TCSD for consideration/approval.
