		However, it is unclear from the Referral if the several dozen employees required to work at the institute will reside permanently at King Ash Bay or in Borroloola. An increase in the local population of 'several dozen' either at King Ash Bay or at Borroloola has the potential to have a substantial impact on the local communities and economies.
		King Ash Bay is a small fishing destination home to several small tourism and hospitality businesses whose business may be disrupted by an increase in population and construction of the 14 demountable building institute.
		In order to assess the impacts on the local community, any subsequent EIS should clarify where the institute's permanent workforce will reside and outline the intended increase in population to King Ash Bay and/or Borroloola.
